RESOLUTION 2016 –107~ SETTLEMENT OF LAWSUITS

WHEREAS, the property owners of properties identified in the attached Schedule “B” have previously commenced legal challenges claiming that the subject properties have been and continue to be assessed at a value which exceeds the appraised value of the subject properties in use for various tax years; and

WHEREAS, the Village Assessor and the Village Attorney have engaged in extensive review of these legal challenges and the basis therefor, and have engaged in extensive research and investigation of the value of these properties for assessment purposes and have had negotiations with the attorneys for the various property owners and based on these negotiations have achieved a settlement of these claims which represent a substantial compromise of the claims and which they recommend is in the best interest of the Village to accept; and

WHEREAS, the refunds from the proposed settlements are without interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Attorney is hereby authorized to execute stipulations of settlement with respect to the Assessment challenges to the properties identified in Schedule “B” attached hereto in accordance with the assessment amount approved and recommended by the Village Assessor and Village Attorney.

RESOLUTION 2016- 108 ~ CREATE THE POSITION OF PAID PARAMEDIC FOR THE NORTHPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Northport Board of Fire Commissioners has determined that it is in the best interest of the Village of Northport to create the position of paramedic and hire paid paramedics to further the health and safety of its residents and the Fire District; and

WHEREAS, the Northport Village Board of Trustees having reviewed the recommendations of the Northport Board of Fire Commissioners has also determined

that it is the best interest of the Village of Northport to create the position of paramedic and hire per diem paramedics; and

WHEREAS, in creating the position of paramedic the Board of Trustees authorizes the Village Treasurer to appropriate from the fund balance a sum not to exceed \$100,000.00 for the remainder of the Village's fiscal year and authorizes the Treasurer to create a budget line to cover the costs of paid paramedics.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT,

RESOLVED, that the Northport Board of Trustees hereby creates the position of Paramedic for the Northport Fire Department and authorizes the Northport Village Treasurer to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$100,000.00 for the remainder of the Village's fiscal year and authorizes the Village Treasurer to create a budget line for said program.

RESOLUTION 2016 – 109 PAID PARAMEDICS

BE IT RESOLVED: The following names; Christopher Barnes, Christopher Bignami, Thomas Fealey, Christopher Gallway, Ross Livinsky, Thomas McCarthy, Daniel Ritter, Joseph Themann, John Wolczok have been approved pending the completion of background checks, for hire as paid Paramedics in the Incorporated Village of Northport, and

WHEREAS: each Paramedic will work no more than 17.5 hours a week at a rate of pay of \$25.00 per hour.

RESOLUTION 2016- 113 AUTHORIZING HARBOUR VILLAS ASSOCIATION, INC., TO USE UP TO AND NOT TO EXCEED 29 INCHES OF VILLAGE PROPERTY FOR A WOODEN BULKHEAD

WHEREAS, Harbour Villas Association, Inc., has requested from the Village of Northport the use of twenty nine (29) inches of Village Property that is situated from the foot of James Street to the western edge of the bulkhead at Harbour Villas that is currently in place; and

WHEREAS, Harbour Villas Association, Inc., makes this request to the Village of Northport for the purposes of replacing their current seawall which is approximately 45 years old and in a deteriorated condition; and

WHEREAS, The new seawall will be placed in front of the old seawall and run from the northern boundary of the Harbour Villa property to the bottom of James Street at latitude 40.9063 and longitude 73.3568; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that by permitting the use of Village property for said new seawall will reduce the possibility of discharge of soil or debris into Northport Harbor if the deteriorated seawall is removed; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the 29 inches of Village Property requested by Harbour Villas Association, Inc., is not used by the Village; and

WHEREAS, in consideration for the use of Village Property Harbour Villas Association, Inc., has agreed to donate to the Village of Northport \$8400.00 for a new composite deck, bench and rail, and the design and installation of a rain garden including plantings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT,

RESOLVED that the Northport Board of Trustees hereby authorizes Harbour Villas Association, Inc., to build a new seawall in front of the current seawall using up to 29 inches of Northport Village property running from the northern boundary of Harbour Villas to the bottom of James Street latitude 40.9063 and longitude 73.3568, and accepts the donation by Harbour Villas Association, Inc., as stated in this Resolution. The use of the property is contingent upon Harbour Villas Association, Inc., receiving all permits required under Federal, State and Local law, if required.

RESOLUTION 2016- 114 ~ ABOLISH HEO POSITIONS AND CREATE MAINTENANCE MECHANIC II POSITIONS

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator has recommended to the Northport Village Board of Trustees that it is in the best interest of the Village of Northport and its

residents to abolishes three (3) positions of HEO and create three (3) positions of Maintenance Mechanic II; and

WHEREAS, the Northport Village Board accepts said recommendation; and
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT,

RESOLVED that the Northport Board of Trustees hereby abolishes three (3) positions of HEO and hereby creates three (3) positions of Maintenance Mechanic II, and all funding to be provided with existing appropriations.

RESOLUTION 2016 – 115~ COW HARBOR 10K RACE PARKING RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS: Police Chief William Ricca has requested the enactment of temporary parking restrictions in connection with the conduct of the Cow Harbor 10K race to be held on Saturday, September 17th, 2016, and

WHEREAS: Chief Ricca has outlined the required temporary parking restrictions in a memorandum to the Board of Trustees, so

BE IT RESOLVED: that the temporary parking restrictions on September 17,2016 for the times and locations listed in the memorandum from Police Chief Ricca be, and hereby are, approved, and the Police Department is hereby authorized to take actions necessary to enforce said restrictions, be, and hereby are, adopted.

RESOLUTION 2016- 116 ~ COW HARBOR DAY PARKING RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS: Police Chief William Ricca has requested the enactment of temporary parking restrictions and Sidewalk Sales Rules and Regulations in connection with the conduct of the Great Cow Harbor Day Festival to be held on Sunday, September 18TH, 2016 from 4:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and,

WHEREAS: Chief Ricca has outlined the required temporary parking restrictions and Sidewalk Sales Rules and Regulations in a memorandum to the Board of Trustees and

WHEREAS: Chief Ricca has recommended that the Board of Trustees empower, the Great Cow Harbor Day Committee - 2016 with the authority to issue permits for sidewalk and park sales on Cow Harbor Day, and

WHEREAS: Chief Ricca has recommended that the Board of Trustees adopt Rules and Regulations governing sidewalk and park sales as recommended by the Great Cow Harbor Day Committee - 2016, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED: that the temporary parking restrictions on the dates and for the times listed in the memorandum from Police Chief Ricca be, and hereby are, approved, and the Police Department is hereby authorized to take actions necessary to enforce said restrictions, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Great Cow Harbor Day Committee -2016 be, and hereby is, authorized to issue permits for sidewalk and park sales on Cow Harbor Day, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the rules and regulations governing sidewalk and park sales, as recommended by the Great Cow Harbor Day Committee - 2016, be, and hereby are, adopted.

RESOLUTION 2016- 117 ~ ROUND ELEVEN OF THE DOWN TOWN REVITALIZATION FUNDS.

WHEREAS: One of the most valuable resources of the Incorporated Village of Northport is its vibrant business, cultural, service, and community-minded organizations, and

WHEREAS: The Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Northport has a great interest in working cooperatively with the Northport Chamber of Commerce in its efforts to promote this vital resource; and

WHEREAS: The Board of Trustees has supported the application of the Northport Chamber of Commerce on previous rounds in seeking funding from a Suffolk County Downtown Revitalization Grant; and

WHEREAS: the Chamber is desirous of putting up an informational kiosk at the foot of Main Street and other informational boards along Main Street with the assistance of additional Suffolk County Downtown Revitalization grant funds, and

WHEREAS: The Village acknowledges their in house contribution to the project in an amount not to exceed \$5,000. now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED:, the Board of Trustees has determined that this action is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617 and not subject to any further action under SEQRA; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees hereby supports the project of the Northport Chamber of Commerce for which Suffolk County Downtown Revitalization (Round 11) grant funds are being sought for the public benefit and authorize the Mayor to execute necessary documentation, approved as to form and content by the Village Attorney, in sponsorship of the grant application.
