FILE 19-34 – 14-16 WOODBINE AVE. – SALTED ON THE HARBOR

Carl Horn from Eclipse Sign presented an application for a new sign at 14-16 Woodbine Ave. The new sign will be made of PVC and be pin mounted on the brick which will be centered above the awning. The awning canvas will be replaced with black sunbrella material. There will be no lettering on the awning. The brick will be painted white there will also be 4 black gooseneck lighting fixtures over the sign. The new sign will say SALTED. On the Harbor with a wave and seagull design at the end. The word SALTED will have white spots incorporated into the design. Gary Blake offered the resolution which was seconded by Steven Keller.

FILE 19-35 – 224 LAUREL AVE.

George Suddell submitted an application to reclaim exterior cedar siding, paint the stucco base a bronze color and recondition the south columns to receive Azek and decorative details. Mr. Suddell proposal also included signage but the verbiage was not discussed. Approval was given for the placement of a pediment sign and the application was approved based on the drawing he submitted. Gary Blake made the motion for approval which Steven King seconded.

The sign will be a single sided sign made of one inch thick Komcell with vinyl printed graphics in gold yellow and navy blue colors with white border and sub text installed to the wall with screws.
