**FILE 19-27 – 6 LAUREL AVE. – FLOWER BASKET**

The owner of the Flower Basket submitted an application to install a sign at 6 Laurel Ave. The new sign will be 28.5” x 170” wide. The letters will be non-illuminated with “Flower Basket” utilizing backlighting against the building via LED. The letters will be created with sign foam painted white and will be attached to the building utilizing 7” aluminum pins. The letters will be 3” off the surface of the building. The words FLOWER BASKET will be 19.75 inches high. The words Florist and Chocolatier will be 1” deep and will be 6.75” tall. All signage will be centered on the storefront. Gary Blake offered the resolution which was seconded by Richard Krulik.

**FILE 19-28 – 245 MAIN ST. – MARTONI**

Mr. Phil Conti from Signs to Go came before the board to request permission to change the face of the sign that is presently installed at 245 Main St. The sign will be resurfaced and will now have a red background with the words MARTONI (top line) ITALIAN EATERY (seconded line) PANINI, GELATO, CAFFE (fourth line) along with the Italian flag on the third line. The letters will be white although there will be green leaves on each side of the word MARTONI. Andrea Miller made the motion for approval which was seconded by Rich Krulik.

**FILE 19-30 – 64 BAYVIEW AVE.**

The owners of 64 Bayview Ave. and their architect came before the board to discuss future renovations to their property. After reviewing the preliminary plans the board advised them to return with their formal application.

**FILE 19-32 – 46 MAIN ST. – SHIPWRECK DINER**

Tim Hess the owner of the Shipwreck Diner submitted an application to take the front of the diner back to the original stained wood. He also requested permission to stain the front door back to mahogany. Brendan Moran offered the resolution which was seconded by Gary Blake.

**FILE 19-33 – 97 LAUREL AVE.**

The owner of 97 Laurel Ave. came to the Archie board to inquire about future renovations on her front porch. After reviewing her ideas the board suggested she finalize her applications and return with her official application.
